


Halifax, Nova Scotia:

One of the city's most attractive areas is the Historic Properties Development, located along the waterfront. The charming early 19th-century wood and stone buildings here have all been fully restored. And the cobblestone streets and long boardwalks are now lined with a wonderful array of boutiques, cafés, and pubs.

Saint John, New Brunswick:

Experience the amazing Reversing Falls Rapids, Saint John's best-known attraction. Twice daily the powerful tides of the Bay of Fundy rise faster than the river can empty. When this happens, the tide attempts to push the river back upstream, then the tide ebbs and the river appears to reverse itself and flow over the rocks, creating the appearance of reversing rapids.



Bar Harbor, Maine:

Explore beautiful Acadia National Park. See Cadillac Mountain and the natural rock formations of Thunder Hole. Journey over bridges to arrive at Jordan Pond House, where you can take in the beautiful scenery of Penobscot Mountain and the Bubble Mountains while enjoying popovers and tea.

Portland, Maine:

The Old Port Exchange is really the heart of downtown Portland. It's a collection of 19th-century brick buildings originally constructed to support the vast export and fishing industries. Today, this quaint, restored area houses specialty shops, restaurants and pubs.



Things You Don't Want to Miss:

- Discover downtown **Halifax** in a brand-new way by visiting many of Halifax's favorite pubs. Sample some of their most popular brands of beer as you make your way from pub to pub. Take a historical and anecdote-filled tour through the streets of Halifax. Explore the hilltop fortress and the Citadel, and stroll through the beautiful Victorian-style public gardens.
- While in **Saint John**, New Brunswick, Visit the historic Trinity Anglican Church, which dates from 1877, when the original structure was destroyed in the Great Fire. Shop at your leisure in the antique and specialty shops located along Prince William Street, then through the Old City Market on Germain Street. Downtown, you can explore Kind Square and walk past the Imperial Theater, Old Country Courthouse and the Loyalist Burial Grounds.
- Nestled on the east side of Mt. Desert Island and surrounded by Acadia National Park, **Bar Harbor** features some of the most spectacular scenery on the Eastern Seaboard. The rock-bound coast, soaring granite cliffs, majestic mountains and blue waters have attracted the Rockefellers, Astors, and Vanderbilts for over 200 years, and continue to enchant visitors today.
- In **Portland**, Maine, visit the Victoria Mansion, one of America's most significant Victorian homes, dating back to 1858. The interior is all original, with antique furniture, carpets, ceramics and wall decorations. 19th-century poet Henry Wadsworth Longfellow was raised in the Wadsworth-Longfellow House in downtown Portland. Tour his home, and see an interesting collection of Maine's historical artifacts.

Grand Suite: Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), private balcony, sitting area, and concierge service. Also referred to as Grand Ocean View Suite. (358-384 sq. ft., balcony 106 sq. ft.) Includes minibar, TV, stereo, DVD player, larger private bathroom with bathtub and double sink, vanity area, hair-dryer, phone, vanity table with an extendable working surface for laptop computers and 110/220 electrical outlets. Sleeps up to four people and can accommodate a rollaway bed and/or Pack 'n Play.

Junior Suite: Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), private balcony, private bathroom with bathtub and a sitting area with sofa bed. (293.9 sq. ft., balcony 66.7 sq. ft.) Also includes minibar, vanity area, hair-dryer, TV, phone, vanity table with an extendable working surface for laptop computers and 110/220 electrical outlets. Sleeps up to 4 guests. **Category JS**



Balcony: Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), private balcony, sitting area, and a private bathroom. (184.1 sq. ft., balcony 43.1 sq. ft.) Also includes minibar, vanity area, hair-dryer, TV, phone, computer jack, vanity table with an extendable working surface for laptop computers and 110/220 electrical outlets. Some have a Pullman bed and/or sofa bed and can accommodate 3-4 guests. Some can also accommodate a rollaway bed or Pack 'n Play. **Category E2**



Outside: Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), sitting area with sofa, vanity area and a private bathroom. (164.7 sq. ft.) Also includes minibar, hair-dryer, TV, phone, vanity table with an extendable working surface for laptop computers, and 110/220 electrical outlets. Some have Pullman beds and can accommodate 3-4 guests. **Category H**



Inside: Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), sitting area, vanity area, and a private bathroom. (165.8 sq. ft.) Also includes minibar, hair-dryer, TV, phone, vanity table with an extendable working surface for laptop computers, and 110/220 electrical outlets. Some have Pullman beds and can accommodate 3-4 guests. **Category M & N**

Free beginner lessons for novices are offered, followed by a low limit hold'em game for beginners only.

The Card Player Cruises staff will be happy to spread any game and limit that enough players want to play.

A general guideline regarding the games and limits on most cruises is as follows:

Texas hold'em: \$2-\$4, \$4-\$8, \$10-\$20, \$20-\$40

Omaha/8: \$4-\$8, \$10-\$20, occasionally higher

Mixed games: \$20-\$40, occasionally higher

No-limit hold'em at blinds of \$1-\$2 and \$2-\$5 with capped buy-ins

All poker games are open to anyone 18 years and older.
